DECLARATION OF BRENDA  
FRITSCHER WILBUR

I, BRENDA FRITSCHER WILBUR, declare as follows:

1. I am over the age of 18 and competent to testify in this matter. The information in this declaration is based on my personal belief.

2. I am a 73 year old married woman and reside at 118 Keystone Avenue in Coupeville, directly under FCLP approach path at Admiral's Cove. I have been married for 52 years and had a career in the social service sector in a variety of administrative

1 positions. I worked for the Juneau (Alaska) School District as a Community Education  
2 Coordinator for about 10 years full time. When my sons went off to college, I was a  
3 social service director at the nursing home for three years, then a Suicide-Crisis Line  
4 coordinator, senior peer counsel coordinator and for three years was the Site Manager  
5 for the Senior Center in Juneau. I also worked in a low-income housing project and a  
6 home health service program. My college degree was in Sociology and I did post  
7 graduate work in gerontology.  
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9 3. We moved here in 2006 and have lived in our home for eight years. My  
10 husband and I gave considerable thought as to where to move. We had lived in Juneau  
11 when it was still town-like and wanted to find a place to live that captured its unique  
12 beauty and was close to our two sons and their families. We chose Whidbey Island  
13 because it met those criteria. The water, mountains, the incredible variety of birds, and  
14 just the many ways we are able to feel close to nature. All of this has been destroyed  
15 by the Growler noise

17 4. Living in the flight path is a source of constant dread and anxiety. The  
18 decibel readings when flying directly over our home on Keystone Ave are about 110 to  
19 119 dBA. When the Growlers fly I become a different person. My anxiety, blood  
20 pressure, and anger increase. I get headaches and feel disoriented. I go into survival  
21 mode. These moods go beyond the times when the jets fly. There is an anticipation  
22 that keeps me on alert with a feeling of dread. I deeply resent having to wear ear  
23 protection just to be able to function.  
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1           5.       All my life I have been active in sports and enjoy the outdoors. I am a  
2 very active 73-year-old woman who loves being outdoors hiking, gardening, walking  
3 my rescue dogs, and going to parks.

4           6.       When the jets fly I feel helpless, angry, unfocused and extremely  
5 frustrated. "The sound of freedom" is detrimental to my well-being. I love my home  
6 across the street from the ocean, beach and rare wildlife. The noise becomes more and  
7 more unbearable with each jet and each 2-4 jet session.

8           7.       The noise has become so unbearable that we have considered moving. It  
9 is a source of such distress that we are considering this. If we did decide to move, we  
10 wonder if we would be able to sell our house and how much loss of value would there  
11 be.

13           8.       In September and October I had two major back surgeries, which caused  
14 a lot of pain and duress. Living under the Growlers, added to the pain and distress of  
15 my recovery. It is unsafe for my family and all the other homes that are in the flight  
16 path. I live knowing that when the jets fly two hundred feet above my house, that an  
17 accident can occur. There is no way I can describe the dread of having to live under  
18 these conditions. It is unfathomable to believe that the Navy with all of its resources  
19 cannot find an appropriate air field to train its aviators that is safe and does not subject  
20 a densely populated area to live under the constant fear of being killed by an 'accident'.  
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23           I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of Washington that  
24 the foregoing is true and correct.
